BULA!!!!! WELCOME TO FIJI

Fiji, blessed with 333 magnificent islands, some inhabited, most not. We are a land where there is still room to move. Set in the tropical South Pacific, Fiji is surely the essence of a tropical island paradise. White sandy beaches, swaying coconut trees, pristine oceans and waterways and a range of things to do and see that will appeal to the most discerning traveler. Revel in our 5-star resorts, stroll on our glimmering white beaches hand-in-hand at sunset, snorkel, dive, surf or kayak our pristine oceans, whitewater raft our clear and clean waterways, cruise the ocean around our mainland and outer islands, trek our rainforests, backpack the outer islands, visit our welcoming villages and experience sustainable living or immerse yourself in our unique culture and history.

And then there's our most precious asset - smiling, generous, relaxed Fijians who greet you and everyone they meet with our famous and welcoming ...!'Bula'!

It is important to dress modestly when away from the immediate vicinity of your resort or hotel. Always carry a sulu (sarong, lavalava, pareu) to cover bathing togs or shorts and halter tops. Fijians are known as the friendliest people in the world. Your respect for their customs and traditions will not only make you a welcome guest in their villages and homes, but add another dimension to your Fijian holiday.

What to buy in Fiji? The Fijians are lovers of elaborate ceremonies, especially the kava ceremony, and a massive wooden kava bowl (tanoa) makes an impressive souvenir (and an excellent salad bowl back home). Smaller tanoas are handy for serving peanuts and the like. Woodcarvings anyone? Recommended are the fearsome Fijian war clubs and cannibal forks which you can buy in most craft outlets and markets around Fiji. For obvious reasons, these items are not available in the duty free shops at Nadi Airport and cannot be carried aboard the plane in your hand luggage. What not to buy in Fiji are the masks and tikis, which are made exclusively for sale to tourists and have no basis in Fijian culture.

Tapa cloth made from the pounded bark of the paper mulberry tree is always a great purchase. You can buy great sheets of the stuff capable of covering an entire wall or smaller pieces painted with the figures of turtles and the like. Do not buy conch shells for environmental reasons and beware that many shells are from endangered species and forbidden to import to the US.

Please also note that there's no tipping in Fiji. However, there's a "community" staff Christmas Fund box where you are welcome to contribute. This is always appreciated and totally optional.

When visiting a Fijian village it is customary to present a gift of yaqona (sevusevu), which is also known as kava. The sevusevu is presented to the Turaga ni Koro, the executive head of the village. The presentation is usually in his house and will generally be attended by some of the older men. Pounded into powder, the yaqona will be mixed with water and served.

Important Tips about Visiting Fijian Villages:

- Dress modestly. Don't wear shorts; women must not wear halter tops or show bare shoulders.
- Do not wear hats or touch anyone's head. They are interpreted as a sign of disrespect.

- Always remove your shoes before entering any house or other building. Stay with your assigned host. If other Fijian villagers ask you to eat or accompany them, politely note that you are with your host and would be honored to visit with them at some other time.
- Speak softly. Raised voices are interpreted as expressing anger.





Known as Aotearoa in the native Maori tongue, which translates to the "land of the long white cloud" New Zealand's culture is as rich as its pastures are green. Maori myths and legends are intriguing and inspiring, the very birth of the nation being one of the more fascinating.

New Zealand is a land with plenty of elbow room; just over four million people live in an area the size of Colorado. Thus the country is still far from overwhelmed with human handiwork. - There is no compulsory tipping in New Zealand and it is completely at the individual's discretion. At restaurants a tip of no more than 10% is customary to reward good service.
- The strength of the US dollar against the New Zealand dollar plus the government's free market policies make for some wonderful bargain shopping. Souvenir items include jewelry made from New Zealand greenstone (jade) and from the iridescent paua shell. Maori Arts and Crafts are reflected in a number of items such as the carved greenstone tiki and intricate wood carvings. New Zealand wool and leather are of remarkable quality and are available in a large range of fashion and traditional products. Trading hours are generally 9.00am to 5.00pm Monday to Friday and 10.00am to 4.00pm on Saturday and Sunday. Stores in most areas stay open until 9.00pm on a Thursday night. Auckland International Airport claims to have some of the best duty free shopping in the world.
